

Inspired By Spring Blooms

School Competition and Exhibition

CALL FOR ENTRIES

Nature has long been a source of inspiration for artists. Commonly known as a time of rejuvenation and rebirth, spring stimulates the senses and welcomes us back to the outdoors. This burst of activity in the natural world from March through May provides many opportunities to inspire your students.

The <u>Indianapolis Museum of Art at Newfields</u> (IMA) invites preschool through 12th grade teachers to share their students' responses to **spring flowers**, **plants**, **and flowering trees**, which will be featured in conjunction with the upcoming exhibition, *Spring Blooms*, from March 30 to May 27, 2018. More information about the exhibition will be available soon at discovernewfields.org. As part of the *Spring Blooms* experience, selected student artwork will be displayed at the IMA.

COMPETITION DESCRIPTION

IMA seeks student work that is inspired by **spring flowers, plants, and flowering trees**. Student work will be divided into four age groups: preschool-2nd grade, 3rd-5th grade, 6th-8th grade, and 9th-12th grade. Selected work will be on display at IMA from March 30 – May 27, 2018.

DUE DATE

February 2nd, 2018

ELIGIBILITY

Open to all students in Indiana, Preschool-12th grade.

AWARDS

- A panel of judges will select 3 winners (1st place, 2nd place, and one honorable mention) per age group to be on display at the IMA.
- Winning artists receive an award and 4 gift tickets to attend the Spring Blooms
 exhibition at their convenience anytime during the public hours of the exhibition. IMA
 will mail the awards to the teachers of selected artists for dissemination.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Participating teachers must submit work as outlined below. If you have questions or need assistance, please contact Calvin Caskey at ccaskey@discovernewfields.org.

To Participate: Teachers develop their own nature/spring/flower-focused lessons for the specific curricular needs in their classroom(s). Teachers can find images of works in the IMA's collection that represent artists' various approaches to depicting flowers, plants, and trees at the end of this document. Teachers may choose other works that fit into their specific school curriculum. Suggested areas of focus include, but are not limited to:

ways artists have depicted flowers, plants, and trees

- o highly realistic, expressive, stylized, abstract
- in the distance/up close
- o in the wilderness, garden, indoors
- o landscape, still life, portraiture genres
- human interactions with nature

color relationships

- o cool/warm colors
- o analogous colors
- complementary colors

science of plant life

- the parts of a flower
- o the role of pollinators
- o bloom times and the life cycle
- best growing environments
- o perennials/annuals

Student artists create original and individual (no group entries) works of art that respond to spring flowers, plants, and flowering trees. Teachers select four works per age group (per school) to submit.

Required Dimensions: Please use 11"x 14" Bristol board or similar acid free paper, HORIZONTALLY oriented. DO NOT add any frame.

Accepted Mediums: Only 2-D work will be accepted for display in the featured gallery. Please use standard 2-D mediums such as paint, paper, gouache, ink, charcoal, marker, pencil, and digital media.

Quantity: Please limit submission to four (4) works <u>per age group, per school</u>. For example, an elementary art teacher might have entries in the *Preschool - 2^{nd} grade* and 3^{rd} - 5^{th} grade age group from two different schools. S/he could submit four works from each age group for each school:

- School 1
 - o Age Group 1, preschool 2nd grade: 4 works
 - o Age Group 2, 3^{rd} 5^{th} grade: 4 works
- School 2
 - o Age Group 1, preschool 2nd grade: 4 works
 - o Age Group 2, 3^{rd} 5^{th} grade: 4 works

Submission Process: All entries will be submitted digitally. The original 11"x 14" student works must be photographed or scanned and the <u>photographs or scans</u> of the original student artworks will be <u>submitted as slides in a Power Point</u> file to the following email address: ccaskey@discovernewfields.org

The first slide of the Submissions Power Point should include the teacher name, teacher email address, teacher phone number, school name, and school address. Each student work should be submitted as a slide. In the notes section for each slide include the student's grade, student's name, title of the artwork, and artist statement (not to exceed 35 words). Please <u>use the attached power point</u> as your guide.

Along with the power point file, teachers should attach a signed Teacher's Consent Form to their submission email. Please use the Teacher's Consent Form at the end of this document.

If Selected: Teachers of the selected winners will be responsible for bringing the original 11"x 14" works to IMA along with consent forms no later than February 23rd, 2018. If a selected original work is not received by that date, that student's work will be dismissed from the competition and an alternate will be selected to fill its place. If your school will be on break, please provide an email address and phone number where you can be reached during that time.

Labels for Artwork: IMA staff will create labels for all of the selected works. Please ensure you submit artwork titles and student artist statements with each artwork. These play a big role in the jurying process.

Delivery Method: All submissions must be digitally emailed to ccaskey@discovernewfields.org. Instructions for bringing the original works to IMA for installation will be emailed to the teachers of selected winners.
