# LIFE AND LEGACY: PORTRAITS FROM THE CLOWES COLLECTION

Life and Legacy: Portraits from the Clowes Collection showcases the extensive collection of portraiture acquired by Dr. George H.A. and Edith Whitehill Clowes in a whole new light. While the galleries in the Clowes Pavilion are redesigned and improved, some of the most popular works/portraits will be on display in this exhibition. This subject was a keen interest of Dr. Clowes and he collected many different styles throughout his life.

# STUDENT ART EXHIBITION BASICS

## Digital Submission Due Date

Friday, March 1st, 2019 at 5 pm

## Eligibility

Open to all students in Indiana, Preschool – 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

## Theme

Portraits

## Selection

- A jury of arts educators will select the works for inclusion in the exhibition.
- Student work will be divided into four age groups: PreK-2<sup>nd</sup> grade, 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade, 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade, and 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Selected artists (and their teachers) will receive a certificate and 4 tickets to visit Newfields. Newfields will mail the certificates to the teachers for dissemination.
- Selected work will be on view for the duration of the exhibition, May 4 to August 18, 2019.

# **Submission Guidelines**

# HOW TO PARTICIPATE

Teachers develop their own lessons for the specific curricular needs in their classroom(s). At the end of this document, teachers can find inspiration from sample images of portraits that will be included in the exhibition, as well as others in the IMA's collection, that represent artists' various approaches to the subject. Teachers may choose other examples that fit into their specific school curriculum. Suggested areas of focus include, but are not limited to, the following:

- A portrait can celebrate someone we admire:
  - o a family member
  - o a friend
  - o a role model
- A portrait can document a family or a family's interests. It can also celebrate an important event, such as:
  - o a family reunion
  - o a school graduation
  - o a wedding
  - o a birth (i.e. newborn baby photos)
- A portrait can be of yourself—a self-portrait. (A "selfie" is a type of self-portrait.) Self-portraits can say something about who we are and what we like:
  - o hobbies, sports
  - o favorite books, movies, or music
  - o favorite places to visit
- A portrait can say something about a person's mood or state of mind:
  - o happy
  - o proud
  - o focused
  - o calm

## • Artists have made portraits in many different ways throughout history:

- o style: realistic, stylized, expressive, abstract
- o format: full-length, half-length, head and shoulders, the face
- pose: the sitter facing the viewer, looking away, in profile, standing up, sitting down
- o setting: indoors, outdoors, alone, with others, time of day
- o lighting: deep shadow, silhouette
- o color: natural color, arbitrary color

## DETAILS

#### **Original Works of Art**

Students create original and individual works of art (no group entries).

#### **Required Dimensions**

Please use 9x12" Bristol board or similar acid free paper. Works may be either horizontally or vertically oriented. DO NOT add any frame.

#### **Accepted Media**

Only 2-D work will be accepted for display in the featured gallery. Please use standard 2-D media such as paint, paper, gouache, ink, charcoal, marker, pencil, collage, photography, or digital media.

#### Quantity

Please limit submission to four (4) works per age group, per school.

For example, an elementary art teacher might have entries in the  $PreK - 2^{nd}$  grade and  $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$  grade age group from two different schools. S/he could submit four works from each age group for each school.

## **Submission Process**

All entries are to be submitted digitally. The original works must be photographed or scanned. Photos or scans are to be submitted as slides in a PowerPoint file to the <u>ccaskey@discovernewfields.org</u>

The first slide of the Submissions PowerPoint should include the following:

- Teacher name
- Teacher email address
- Teacher phone number
- School name
- School address

Each student work should be submitted as a slide. In the notes section for each slide, include the following:

- Student's name
- Student's grade
- Title of the artwork
- Student artist statement (not to exceed 35 words)
- Media

Along with the power point file, teachers should attach a signed Teacher's Consent Form to their submission email. Please use the Teacher's Consent Form at the end of this document.

#### If Selected

Teachers of the selected winners will be responsible for bringing the original works to the IMA at Newfields along with consent forms no later than Friday, March 22, 2019. If a selected original work is not received by that date, the work will be dismissed from the selection process and an alternate will be selected to fill its place.

#### Labels for Artwork

Newfields staff will create labels for the selected works. Please ensure you submit artwork titles and student artist statements with each artwork. These play a big role in the jurying process.


